ISAR Honours 2020: Best practices on sustainability and SDG reporting

The UN Conference for Trade and Development (UNCTAD) has announced that nominations are open for company best practice in Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) reporting. Companies are invited to submit nominations through the International Standards of Accounting and Reporting (ISAR) Honours 2020.

The ISAR Honours Initiative recognises the policy, institutional and capacity-building efforts of different stakeholders in encouraging and assisting enterprises to publish data on their contribution to the implementation of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

UNCTAD explains how the ISAR Honours "aim to raise awareness and facilitate dissemination of national and international best practices on sustainability and SDG reporting." The ISAR Honours supports both the public and private sector in enhancing the quality and comparability of companies' reporting. Companies are assisted by publishing data on their SDG implementation and in turn this helps Governments to collect data for SDG monitoring.

The National Business Initiative (NBI) invites interested member companies to submit nominations, which meet the **ISAR Honours Criteria** in the area of sustainability and SDG reporting.

Companies submitting nominations for the ISAR Honours need to do so before 30 June 2020.

The final results of the ISAR Honours will be unveiled at the ISAR event, held during the **World Investment Forum**, taking place from 6 - 10 December 2020 in Abu Dhabi.
