Launch of the Race to Zero Campaign held on World Environment Day

The 5th of June 2020 simultaneously marked World Environment Day and the launch of the Race to Zero Campaign, uniting leading climate action networks on the delivery of structured net-zero greenhouse-gas emission pledges by the COP26 UN Climate Conference in 2021.

This Initiative mobilizes a coalition of leading net zero initiatives, representing **449 cities**, **21 regions**, **995 businesses**, **38 of the biggest investors and 505 universities**. These 'real economy' actors join 120 countries in the <u>largest ever</u> <u>alliance</u> committed to achieving net zero carbon emissions by 2050 at the latest. Collectively these actors now cover nearly 25% of global CO_2 emissions and over 50% GDP.

<u>Led by the UNFCCC High-Level Climate Champions for Climate Action – Nigel Topping and Gonzalo Muñoz -</u> Race To Zero mobilizes actors outside of national governments to join the <u>Climate Ambition Alliance</u>, which was launched at the UNSG's Climate Action Summit 2019 by the President of Chile, Sebastián Piñera. The objective is to build momentum around the shift to a decarbonized economy ahead of COP26, where governments must strengthen their contributions to the Paris Agreement. This will send governments a resounding signal that business, cities, regions and investors are united in meeting the Paris goals and creating a more inclusive and resilient economy.
