




Working with business to facilitate its role in implementing the National Development Plan by developing a voluntary plan of action leading to implementable collective action projects rooted in the NDP



NBI Strategic Context

The NBI aims to drive business participation in economic transition and social transformation and to develop collective action projects that build stakeholder trust and deliver development outcomes.



Our approach is to drive conversations that lead to action, through 3 areas:

Strategic thought leadership

that uncovers areas of shared risk and opportunity which form the basis for designing collective action programmes and understanding implementation approaches.

Building the capacity of all stakeholders

with a focus on business, to engage in potential collective action programmes; building parity in knowledge, understanding and capacity across partners to enhance the potential for success.

Designing and implementing collective projects

that lead to business-led solutions which unlock developmental outcomes to drive sustainable growth; underpinned by business being able to engage in courageous conversations with multiple stakeholders.


The NDP is the vision for South Africa to 2030 with numerous government policies aligning with it including the Medium Term Strategic Framework (MTSF) and 9 Point Plan. The MTSF outcomes are a set of KPIs for implementing the NDP in the short-term up to 2020.

9 Point Plan*:

- 1 Resolving the energy challenge
- 2 Revitalising agriculture and the agro-processing value chain
- 3 Advancing beneficiation or adding value to the mineral wealth 4 More effective implementation of a higher impact Industrial
- 5 Encouraging private-sector investment
- 6 Moderating workplace conflict


Policy Action Plan (IPAP)

Vision in Action



NDP Policy Mapping






Consultation Process

The NBI followed a robust consultative process to prioritise activities in support of the NDP.



Ranking	Theme	Action Item Description
1	Strengthen Partnerships with Local Government	Strengthen partnerships between the private sector and local government, drawing on existing public and private sector initiatives
2	Partner with Municipalities to address Wastewater Treatment	Partner with wastewater treatment works to improve sewage treatment capacity and green drop performance
3	Enhance Relationships between TVET Colleges and Industry	Build a strong relationship between the TVET college sector and industry in support of graduate placement and employability
4	Support Nation Building and Social Cohesion	Facilitate dialogue on the role of business in supporting social cohesion and nation building, and work to implement specific recommendations and programmes emerging out of this process
5	Incorporate a Greater Share of Gas in the Energy Mix	Incorporate a greater share of gas in the energy mix, both through importing liquefied natural gas and if reserves prove commercial, using shale gas. Develop infrastructure for the import of liquefied natural gas, mainly for power production, over the short to medium term
6	Cross-cutting Role of NBI in Supporting Collaboration	NBI to identify existing company NDP initiatives that can be scaled up, or that could benefit from collaborative business action. NBI to further support implementation between business and government
7	Fighting Corruption	In partnership with relevant institutions, support the development of a collective business voice that tackles corruption in the public and private sector. This anti-corruption alliance to report corruption and highlight best practices in reducing corruption
8	Education, Training & Innovation	Government should partner with the private sector to raise the level of R&D, with resources targeted towards building the research infrastructure required by a modern economy
9	ICT, Water & Transport	Embark on private sector water conservation programmes, in line with national government efforts
10	Education, Training & Innovation	Basic education: Bolstering teacher training
11	ICT, Water & Transport	Work with water service authorities to improve potable water and blue drop performance
12	Environmental Sustainability	Engage on South Africa's waste legislation to address impediments to SMME development within waste recycling and the waste value chain
