BACKGROUND

The National Business Initiative's (NBI) Ethical Leadership and Anti-Corruption (ELAC) Programme was established as a direct response to the 2018 Job Summit Agreement Framework and a recognition of the need to address corrupt and unethical practices and behaviours in the private sector. The programme recognises the need to critically change the dialogue on corruption by activating leadership and empowering ordinary South African employees to make the right choices.

Our ELAC training aims to address the organisational and behavioural aspects of driving ethics and anti-corruption. Over the past few years, we have learnt that despite organisations and companies putting in place compliance-driven systems and processes, unethical behaviour persists. Thus, business must be intentional about improving the quality of their ethical fitness programme and the secret ingredient lays with social behaviour. This course is the start to improving and embedding accountability within the private sector.
