

The Global Risks Report 2025 emphasizes that climate-related challenges dominate the long-term risk landscape, with climate change and its consequences—such as extreme weather events, biodiversity loss, and resource scarcity—posing severe social, economic, and environmental threats over the next decade. These risks are immediate and escalating, impacting infrastructure, food security, public health, and global stability.

Addressing these interconnected requires urgent, coordinated efforts to reduce emissions, enhance resilience, and adapt to changing conditions. Delayed action will amplify costs and consequences, proactive measures crucial making sustainability. safeguarding long-term Additionally, the report highlights systemic overlap of geopolitical, environmental, societal, and technological risks, necessitating innovative strategies and long-term planning for global resilience.
